RE: **Budget Amendment #9 – Initiative #15 200 East Mid-block Crosswalk**

During the briefing on Budget Amendment #9 the Council discussed the proposed 200 east mid-block crosswalk. The Council agreed to fund the development of open space on the east side of the Library block but wanted additional information on the crosswalk. During the public hearing on Budget Amendment #9 the Council delayed consideration of the funding of the crosswalk until additional information could be provided. The Council received additional information and was presented with renderings of the proposed crosswalk during a briefing on October 3, 2002. The Council will consider the funding of the crosswalk during the October 8, 2002 Council meeting.

The following are possible motions that the Council may make concerning the 200 east mid-block crosswalk.

1. ["I move that the Council"] Fund the full amount requested: \$311,434.
2. ["I move that the Council"] Fund the reconfiguration of the horseshoe in the amount of \$148,609, to allow for a center-aligned crosswalk and install the traffic signal with Transportation Division funds.
3. ["I move that the Council"] Not fund the request but direct the Administration to install the traffic signal with Transportation Division funds.
4. ["I move that the Council"] Not fund the proposal and request that the Administration bring this proposal before the Council at a later date.
