RECOMMENDATION: Approve increase in five appointed positions within the Police Department.

BUDGET IMPACT: The reorganization creates an immediate budgetary savings of over \$14,000 with projected potential savings of over \$300,000 annually in future years.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

Significant changes have occurred in the command structure of the Police Department. These changes will dramatically improve Police efficiency and response not only to the needs of the community but to the needs of employees. Enhanced accountability for direct decision making will improve all processes throughout the organization.

The rank of Assistant Chief has been eliminated. The rank of Captain will be eliminated through attrition. Eleven command level positions were reduced to eight.

The most important benefit of these changes will be realized in efficiency and effectiveness. This change creates more opportunities for upward mobility and a modernization of an outdated system. Modern business models advocate a flat and dynamic leadership structure bringing those individuals performing the work closer to those making leadership decisions.



Department responsibilities will be divided among eight bureau commanders. Those positions are as follows:

Facilities Development – Deputy Chief Tim Doubt Administration – Deputy Chief Lee Dobrowolski Communication and Records – Deputy Chief Jim Coleman Fusion – Deputy Chief Mike Brown Investigations – Deputy Chief Scott Atkinson Management Services – Deputy Chief Rick Findlay Patrol – Deputy Chief Ken Pearce Special Operations – Deputy Chief Terry Fritz
